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JERUSALEM & THE 3RD TEMPLE

In discussions about Jerusalem and Jewish history, you may encounter the Hebrew term Har HaBayit (הר הבית). For those unfamiliar with Hebrew, let's break it down...

THE MOUNTAIN OF THE HOUSE

Put together, Har HaBayit literally translates to “The Mountain of the House” – but this isn’t referring to just any house. In Jewish tradition, The House refers specifically to the Holy Temple, which once stood on this very hill in Jerusalem.

HAR - BEIT?

In discussions about Jerusalem and Jewish history, you may encounter the Hebrew term Har HaBayit (הר הבית). For those unfamiliar with Hebrew, let’s break it down:

- Har (הר) means mountain or hill.
- Ha (ה) means the.
- Bayit (בית) means house.

Thus, Har HaBayit is the Hebrew name for what is commonly called in English the Temple Mount – the elevated platform in Jerusalem that was home to the First Temple (built by King Solomon) and the Second Temple (rebuilt after the Babylonian exile and expanded by King Herod). The Temple Mount remains one of the most sacred and historically significant sites in Judaism, as well as being significant in Islam and Christianity.

“THE HOUSE” REFERS TO THE HOLY TEMPLE

Today, the area is home to several important religious structures and is often the focus of deep religious, cultural, and political attention.
